

Concert season 23-24: simplified subscription structure

The Tonkunstler Orchestra's programme in the Musikverein Wien and in Lower Austria

Choose between five, seven or twelve concerts in a subscription and between Sunday afternoon or evening performances, with corresponding discounts. With a simplified subscription structure for its symphonic concert programmes, the Tonkunstler Orchestra is making it easier for audiences to choose their musical experiences in the Musikverein Wien. From now on there will be no more distinction between Series A and B, and there will no longer be special subscriptions like «Symphonic on Sunday» and thematic collections. One thing that will stay is the offer we introduced last year especially for families with children: as part of its educational work, the orchestra is offering an afternoon programme for all generations on three selected family Sundays. A creative workshop during one half of the concert will introduce children to the orchestral pieces before, in the second half, they experience popular masterpieces in the Golden Hall. As part of every subscription in the Musikverein Wien there will once more be the option to book the traditional Tonkunstler New Year's Concert.

For the Tonkunstler Orchestra 23–24 season in the Musikverein Wien, we're again planning a dozen symphonic subscription programmes, beginning with the Austrian premiere of Thomas Larcher's new orchestral work Time and ending with Gustav Mahler's Ninth Symphony as the season finale. These are reflected in full in the major series of the evening subscriptions and the Sunday afternoon concerts. The finest traditions of symphonic music are to be found in masterpieces by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky, Anton Bruckner and Gustav Mahler, while outstanding guest soloists play virtuoso concertos of Classicism and Romanticism. Five concert programmes are conducted by Tonkunstler Music Director Yutaka Sado. Renowned guest conductors – Jun Märkl, John Storgårds, Tomáš Netopil, Hugh Wolff and Fabien Gabel – return to the orchestra's podium; Tabita Berglund and Riccardo Frizza lead the Tonkunstler Orchestra through symphonic subscription concerts in the Musikverein for the first time.

In addition to **twelve symphonic subscription programmes**, the Tonkunstler Orchestra again provides a broad stylistic palette of music on three evenings of the **Plugged-In** world music series. We also offer our **festival concerts** to mark Christmas, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Good Friday. The orchestra is booked for three ambitious **stage productions** in the **Festspielhaus St. Pölten** and attendance at the **Grafenegg Festival** in summer 2023. With a **festival for St. Pölten**, the Tonkunstler and their celebrated guests open the Lower Austrian capital's **revamped Cathedral Square** on 8 September 2023. The Actionist and painter **Hermann Nitsch**, who died in summer 2022, will be honoured on 31 October with a memorial concert in the **Musikverein Wien** under the baton of **Patrick Hahn**. The Tonkunstler Orchestra will also perform a number of concerts in its Lower Austrian residencies in **Baden** and **Wiener Neustadt**.



As part of **Tonspiele**, its music **education programme**, the Tonkunstler Orchestra offers events for children, young people, schools and families. This focus on **education and communication** is reinforced not least by the subscription series for the presented concert format **Explained**. **Experienced!**, once again offered in three parts, with the Ö1 radio presenter **Albert Hosp**. There are also concert introductions, rehearsal visits and presented concert formats aimed at adult music-lovers.

There are currently 13 young musicians in the Tonkunstler **Orchestra Academy** preparing themselves for the complexity of orchestral life. The Tonkunstler Academy offers places for up to 14 emerging musicians.

Since 2016, the orchestra's own **label** has released more than 20 CDs. There have already been three new CDs in 2023 alone: the **Third** and **Fourth Symphonies** by **Gustav Mahler** and the Plugged-In production **Symphonic Alps**, recorded with the **Herbert Pixner Projekt**.

The Tonkunstler Orchestra is the only Austrian symphony orchestra to hold three major residencies. It does so thanks to its regular **venues**: the **Musikverein Wien**, the **Festspielhaus St. Pölten** and **Grafenegg**. 40 percent of the orchestra's members are women. The average age is 42.
